Buildings & Missions fund invests in Diocese

The Island is being supported by the Archbishops' Council's Building for Mission fund by with a Church Building Support Officer (CBSO) role. After a review of the first year of the NZC on the Island it became apparent that there was a crossover with the CBSO role and that to be effective more help was required.

I have been given the opportunity to assume both roles for the Diocese, which support parishes in ensuring our churches are resilient and environmentally responsible. I am delighted to say that I will be able to provide holistic support to help preserve our building heritage fit for mission, all while embracing a greener future.

Our Islands Churches are wonderfully led by Clergy and supported by volunteers, who give their time and financial support so generously. This investment will help release resources, energy and potential for mission and outreach.

The Bishop of Ramsbury, Andrew Rumsey, joint lead bishop for Church Buildings, said: *"Our churches and cathedrals are invaluable signs of our Christian presence and heritage. It is essential that we protect and sustain them as centres for worship and community service. This programme aims to reduce the burden of buildings management on parishes and dioceses - through better support arrangements"*

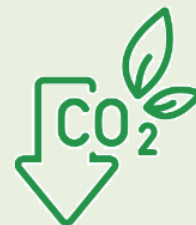
