The Church of England's Energy Footprint Tool 2025 is now open for churches to enter 2024 energy use. This work is an essential part of caring for God's Creation, by helping to combat global heating and climate change.

This <u>easy-to-use tool</u> will tell your church what your carbon footprint is, based on the energy you use to heat and light your buildings.

- If you want to apply for Net Zero grants, you will need to fill in the FET
- Your findings will help inform carbon reducing projects
- And help the Church of England monitor progress towards becoming net zero carbon by 2030.

The Church of England's ambitious **Net Zero Carbon by 2030** campaign aims to equip, resource, and support all parts of the Church to reduce carbon emissions from the energy used in its buildings, schools and through work-related transport by 2030.

The **ambitious target** was set out by General Synod in response to the climate crisis. Climate change hits hardest on the poorest communities round the world and on the poorest people in every society.

Responding to the climate crisis is an essential part of our responsibility to care for God's creation and achieve a just world and supports our local mission.
